Walter Baslyk, teacher (Quebec)

Walter Baslyk has been involved in education in the Montreal area for the past twenty-five years both as a teacher and as a Social Studies Consultant for the Protestant School Board of Greater Montreal and the Lester B. Pearson School Board. Mr. Baslyk has as well sat on various Ministry of Education committees involving evaluation and pedagogical development.

Paul Bennett, Headmaster, Halifax Grammar School (Nova Scotia)
